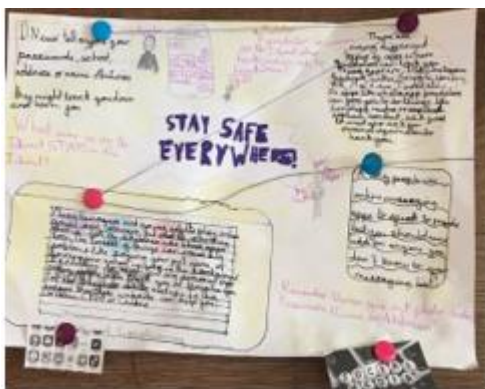

## E-Safety

It was fantastic to see so many of the children attend the e-safety Teams session I ran. The evening before running the session, I attended the Two Johns E-safety training and was amazed at how much I found out, despite attending numerous sessions before. The internet and technology is evolving all the time and one of the current concerns which was discussed, was the video content available to young people on apps such as Youtube and Tiktok. Following my training with the Two Johns, I adapted my session with the children to focus on these most current issues that have come to light. # Presentation

After the last lockdown, we noticed that many of the children's presentation and handwriting had slipped as a consequence of working mostly digitally - which of course could not be helped. As a school, we would like to try and prevent this from happening again so would encourage the children to complete work in exercise books, where ever possible, and present their work as they would be expected to in school. Some of the work set naturally lends itself to being completed in Seesaw which is not a problem. Some of the key presentational features I would like too emphasise are; lines drawn with rulers, dates underlined, 1 box per digit (in maths) and neat, joined-up handwriting for written work. When the lifeboats are launched some are only half full.	6. 15th April 4:10-8:30am: the Carpathia picks up the survivors (710) in the lifeboats. It arrives in New York on the 18th April 1912.
